festival, where they came top of their group, and a fixtures night where they won 2 games and lost 2 games. Our football team also won one game and drew one game at their fixtures night earlier this month. A huge well done to all children involved and a massive thank you to all the parents who have supported us by providing transport to these events, we couldn't do it without you.

PSHE with Mrs Andreas

We have concluded our topic for this half term on 'Me and My Relationships'. Our topic after half term is called 'Rights and Respect'.

In Reception the children have been identifying different emotions including happy, sad, angry and calm. They have learnt some strategies to use if they are feeling 'not so good' feelings, including calming breaths (five finger breathing, square breathing). They made calming sensory shakers (this linked to science - floating and sinking). They have enjoyed a little bit of Yoga as well.

Next - How to care for my special people, my home and my school. How they can make an impact on the natural world.

In Year One the children have been learning what it means to be a good friend, and why we like our friends. They created a recipe for friendship (honesty, sharing, taking turns, respect, love, playing together etc). We then talked about how we can sometimes fall out with our friends, so we created a recipe for making up as well (saying sorry, offering a hug/fist pump, playing favourite games etc).

Next - Recognising how a person's behaviour (including their own) can affect other people. Identifying what they like about the school environment, then thinking about who looks after it.

In Year Two we have discussed bullying and defined it as behaviour that is repeated, hurtful and on purpose. We identified three types of bullying: Verbal (unkind words), Indirect (unkind messages online, leaving people out) and Physical (hitting/pinching etc). The class thought about how to look after someone who is being bullied (being an 'Upstander', speaking to a trusted grown up etc).

Next - Getting on with others in the classroom. Learning strategies for dealing with (their own) impulsive behaviour.

In Year Three the children have been learning about opinions. They were given several statements such as 'There should be more PE in schools' and had to decide where they would place themselves on an 'agree/disagree' continuum. It led to a discussion around considering other people's points of view. The children were encouraged to explain why they held certain opinions. We then talked about dares and how they involve putting pressure on someone to participate in unsafe, unacceptable or risky behaviour. We discussed strategies they could use if they felt uncomfortable or unsafe if someone asked them to do a dare.

Next - identifying key people who are responsible for keeping them to stay safe and healthy. Also, understanding how an event can be perceived from different viewpoints.

In Year Four the children have been looking at differences between being unkind, bullying and teasing. They looked at examples of pressure causing people to behave in unhealthy or risky ways (peer/media

pressure). They also did some pre-learning for our next topic by researching the work that some environmental organisations do (such as the RSPB, WWF and the Woodland Trust).

Next - How different people in the school and local community help them to stay safe and healthy. Defining the word 'responsibility' and recognising that with increased independence, comes increased responsibility.

In Year Five, the children have been learning about their emotional needs. They created a character and had to give them three strengths, three weaknesses, name three things their best friend would say about them, and more. The children have been learning the terms 'assertive', 'passive' and 'aggressive'. They have had a chance to practise their assertiveness skills during drama/role play within the class.

Next - Understanding the difference between fact and opinion. expressing their own opinions on issues concerning health and wellbeing. Understanding what is meant by biased reporting and the need to think critically about what we read.

In Year Six the children have had discussions around consent and how some types of physical touch can produce negative feelings. The class were given a range of scenarios to discuss involving 'appropriate' and 'inappropriate' touch. We also reviewed the NSPCC's 'PANTS' rule. They completed some pre-learning for the next topic and had a discussion about jobs and taxes. We talked about how different jobs have different levels of pay and that they require different skill sets.

Next - they will be defining the terms: fact, opinion, biased and unbiased. They will be analysing a newspaper report and extracting fact versus opinions.

Anti-Bullying Update

The Oaklands Anti-Bullying Ambassadors have been working hard this half term. Firstly, they are in the process of re-branding their name, so watch this space for an update! The team consists of five children in Year 5 (Benjamin B, LJ, Kimberly, Samuel and Maiya), and five children in Year Four (Archie, Ellie, Zoe, Joshua and Xander).

This year, we will be focusing our work around the topics of 'Respect' and 'Wellbeing' aiming to achieve new badges for the school in these areas. In order to complete each badge, the school must show evidence that we have taken part in specific events/opportunities to promote these topics.

For now, the team's efforts lie with the Respect badge. They will be leading an assembly to explain this in more detail to the rest of the school, including how other children can get involved.

It is national 'Anti-Bullying Week' in November (WB 13th) and we are excited to announce that Bigfoot Education are returning to Oaklands to lead a drama workshop to each class, around the theme of Respect. To kick start the week, we will be inviting everyone to wear odd socks on Monday 13th November, as part of the Anti-Bullying Alliance's campaign to 'Make a Noise About Bullying'. The key message with Odd Socks day is that we celebrate how we are all unique, no one person (or sock) is the same, and that's amazing! We would like to suggest a £1 donation on this day that will go towards the Anti-Bullying Alliance and the brilliant work that they do to stand up against bullying.

Donaldson

Donaldson have had an incredible few weeks. In our phonics we have been busy looking at lots of new sounds and practicing saying them out loud. If you would like to see how the children are being taught to pronounce the sound then take a look on tapestry where a sheet has been uploaded to provide support at home! We have been using our whiteboards in phonics to practice writing out our sounds and this has made us feel confident to recognise the sounds! We have really enjoyed practicing our sounds and the children have made fantastic progress this half term.

In our maths learning we have been learning to subitize. This means to look at objects or images and know the number represented without counting e.g. there are 5 buttons there. We used this learning to help us work out how many candles, cups and plates we would need for a party!

We have continued to think about our Oaklands values, kindness, respect and honesty. We have taken scenarios that occur during the day and discussed how they can be resolved. We have agreed that when taking turns it is okay if someone says we can have a toy after them instead of handing it over immediately as they may not be finished with their turn. This has helped us to wait our turn.

After half term we will look at our new topic Sparkle and Shine. This will be thinking about different festivals and celebrations that different cultures and religions take part in. This includes Diwali, firework night and much more! If any parents are able to come in and discuss celebrations occurring in their religion or culture they would be most welcome. In maths we will look at counting one more and one less. We will think about how counting forwards and backwards can help us in understanding the world. We will continue to sing plenty of songs, read lots of stories and explore the world around us.

Murphy

Murphy class have made an excellent start to Year 1. This first half term has been full of celebrations and achievements in many different forms!

We have simply LOVED our Naughty Bus Literacy text and we are so glad he made his way back to school after his adventure! Naughty Bus has inspired so much writing this half term, he has helped us to write longer sentences and use adjectives in our work. We can't wait to share our literacy books with you at parents evening!

In Science we have investigated the properties of different materials by carrying out simple tests such as testing to see if some materials are waterproof.

As mathematicians, we have really secured our learning and understanding of Place Value, within 10. We have enjoyed visits from Tiny and Ickerty Bickerty to support us with our problem solving and our fluency. We have been identifying and representing numbers using objects and pictorial representations including the number line, and use the language of: equal to, more than, less than (fewer), most, least

We have started our music lessons, where we have been exploring different types of music, genre of music and how songs are made up of an intro, verse and chorus. They were particularly fond of 'Hey, You!' as this had lots of repetition and a steady beat.

In Geography, our topic came to an end as we recapped on the 5 oceans, one of our missions this week was to name and locate the 5 oceans on a world map.

After half term we will be: -

- Literacy - A new unit with our key text, 'I want my hat back'
- Maths - Exploring part-whole models and number sentences
- Science - Our new project is 'Human Senses;' we will name and count body parts and identify similarities and differences. We learn about the senses, the body parts associated with each sense and their role in keeping us safe
- History - Learning about everyday life and families today, including comparisons with childhood in the 1950s, using artefacts and a range of different sources

We hope you all have a lovely half term break!

Dahl

This week Year 2 have been engaging in new learning across a range of subjects!

In Literacy, they have been creating their own non-fiction texts based on wolves. They have had the chance to research and plan answers to questions before writing up this information into paragraphs. For the next two lessons they will be converting all of their planning into their final leaflets.

In Maths, we have been looking at addition and subtraction of two numbers across tens. They have been using different methods such as drawing tens and ones and partitioning numbers to help them work the answers out independently.

In History, we have now finished our topic as we have investigated the lives of our significant people in more detail. They recently created their own fact files about Rosa Parks using their own prior knowledge as well as information packs.

In Art, we have started to look at Still Life artwork and the children were very observant to realise that two of the artists link to our History topic- Paul Cezanne and Pablo Picasso.

In RE, we have continued to learn about Navratri which is a Hindu celebration. They explored the special clothing that is worn during this celebration before discussing what outfits they would wear for their own special occasion.

After half term we will be learning about:

- Maths- Addition and Subtraction
- Literacy- Reading the book, 'A Journey Home' and learning about endangered animals
- Science- Human Survival
- Art- Drawing our own still life pictures
- DT- learning about where food comes from and how to prepare vegetables for a soup

to the Bronze Age. The class loved becoming archaeologists and using evidence from a grave to explore a historical person and gather facts about him. They also created some super posters about life in the Bronze Age - recalling all of their learning.

In Literacy we started a new book called 'The First Drawing'. The class have enjoyed reading this book and really explored it in depth, using all of their knowledge of the Stone Age. We have used adverbial phrases to sequence parts of the text and retold the story as if we were the main character.

In Maths we have been looking at addition and subtraction. We have been learning about how our knowledge of our number bonds can help us add to numbers together and bridge 10 - For example; $356 + 9$ - we would do $356 + 4$ making 360, then add the remaining 5.

In Science we have continued to look at animals and humans. We have been exploring bones, muscles and joints in the skeleton. The class loved taking part in an experiment which involved long cardboard tubes over our arms, making movement very difficult and highlighted the importance of our joints. We have also explored several types of skeletons.

The class have become enthusiastic in PE this half term. During their Friday lessons, we have been exploring dance and how we can use our bodies to create representations. They have spent the term choreographing their own counts of 8 to represent machines in a factory and trips to space, underwater and to the beach.

After half term, we will be learning:

- Maths: Column method for addition and subtraction.
- Literacy: New Book - The Heart and the Bottle -Exploring characters. (Please do not read it yet!)
- D&T: Bell Beaker Pots
- Geography: Longitude and Latitude
- History: Life in the Iron Age

Morpurgo

Year 4 have had a lovely couple of weeks. In Literacy, we have started looking into the book 'The Mermaid of Zennor' which started off looking at what could be happening and making interesting predictions based on information we already know. Once we found out that the mysterious lady in the story was a mermaid, we were able to find out why she was there and how this legend came about. We have been working towards writing a non-chronological report which will give the reader information about Zennor.

In Maths, we have started our addition and subtraction block. We have been understanding efficient ways to use column addition and column subtraction to solve 4-digit by 4-digit calculations. As well as practising the method, we have been looking at questions and spotting mistakes to understand why it is so important to start from the units column.

In Topic, we have continued to look into the range of invasions that took place across Britain. We have also been discussing whether the geography of Britain helped or hindered invaders. Also in topic, we have been looking at North and South America and understanding the difference between a continent, a country and a state. This week children have looked at North and South America to identify physical

features which are there due to the climate. We have been exploring why some countries only have one climate whereas others may have many.

In PE, we have finished off our tennis and hockey units which have led us to play games against each other to practise skills that we have been developing over the half term.

In RE, we have been looking at the festival of Janmashtami and why Hindus use song and dance to celebrate. This has also helped us understand what a role model is and why we have them. This has linked to our homework from earlier in the fortnight.

After half term we will be looking at:

- Literacy - A new book called FARThER.
- Maths - Continuing to work through addition and subtraction, leading on to shape.
- Topic - Continuing to look at why Britain was invaded and being able to identify physical features of the United Kingdom.
- PE - Starting new units of football on a Wednesday and dance on a Friday
- Science - Sound and how it travels.

Westall

As we reach the end of our first half term in year 5, we have been working hard on our learning.

In literacy we have been reading an adapted version of 'The Tempest' by William Shakespeare. We have really enjoyed exploring the themes, ideas and characters in the play, and have written character descriptions and diary entries. This week, we wrote our own playscript of 'The Tempest' and performed them to the class.

In maths, we have been using our knowledge of timetables to work on multiples, factors, square numbers and prime numbers as part of the unit 'multiplication and division'.

Last week in science to complete our unit on forces and mechanisms, we worked in our table groups to test air resistance using paper parachutes. This week in our groups, we tested the water resistance of two plasticine shapes with the same mass, dropped in water. One was used as the 'control' and the other was changed each time.

In history, we explored how the Shang Dynasty eventually ended and compared it to other bronze age civilisations we learnt about in previous year groups. We observed at their similarities and what was unique to the Chinese dynasties.

In RE, we looked at the blue part of the Buddhist flag which represented 'compassion' and discussed as a class, different ways people had showed us compassion.

After half term we will be learning:

- Maths: multiplying, dividing by 10, 100 and 1000 and fractions
- Literacy: reading Hidden Figures by Margot Lee Shetterly
- Science : Earth and space

- PE: dodgeball and dance
- RE: Passover
- Geography: locating map features using a range of methods

Tolkien

In Literacy we have started our new book 'Windrush Child'. We have learned about the Empire Windrush and how it brought West Indians to the UK to help rebuild the country after WWII. We have practised using adverbials, relative clauses and different types of sentences during this writing.

Quick Quiz: What year did the Empire Windrush bring people to England?

In Maths we have continued learning mental and written methods for the four operations. We have learned the 'bus stop' method for division and have used estimation to help.

QQ: will 1.8×50 be above or below 100?

In grammar, punctuation and spelling we have been learning about simple, compound and complex sentences. QQ: find the subordinate clause: We played football after we ate our breakfast.

In history we have learned about the process of moving slaves from Africa to the plantations. We have also learned about slave rebellions.

In Destination Reader we have been reading 'Freedom', the story of 12-year old Nat, a slave who moves from Jamaica to an England in the 18th century.

In music we have added music to our song, 'Happy'.

We have also been practising our class assembly for Friday!

After half term:-

- We will finish Windrush Child and Freedom.
- We will also start our fractions unit in maths.
- In topic, we will start our Geography unit, learning all about this beautiful world on which we live.
