Eco-Schools with Mrs Bissmire

'No Mow May' is here and we have requested that some of our school grass areas are not mowed during the month of May. This is great for biodiversity in our school grounds, creating long grass, wildflower areas which in turn attracts all sorts of butterflies, bees, bugs etc to the area. For some it is their first food source of the Spring for others it is just a nice meal and a chance to pollinate! Maybe you can take a break from the weekly mowing task, or just leave a section and see what you can attract to your own garden, just watch out for sleepy bees laying on clover in the mornings taking in the sun to warm up!

PSHE Update from Mrs Andreas

Reception

The children have been learning about how humans grow and change from a baby, to a toddler, to a child. They looked at pictures of people at different life stages and read the story 'Once There Were Giants' by Martin Waddell.

Next, we will be reading the text 'And Tango Makes Three' by Peter Parnell and Justin Richardson and will talk about how every family is unique. We will also be discussing where a baby grows (in a woman's tummy), and what a baby needs when it is born (e.g. milk, love, sleep and lots of nappy changes!)

Year One

The children have been learning about what a newborn baby needs (e.g. milk, sleep, cuddles, nappy changes) and what an older baby needs (playtime, tummy time, naps, solid food, stories etc).

Next, they will be recapping what they already know about bullying – what is bullying and how is it different to teasing? How could they help someone who is being bullied?

Year Two

The children have been naming body parts and have talked about the differences between girls and boys bodies. They will be considering the question: Why do we have different private parts?

Next, they will be learning about respecting other people's privacy, for example, it isn't respectful to look through a person's bag without their permission to do so. We will also discuss privacy in terms of our 'private parts' and our 'private information'.

Year Three

The children have been learning about how to stay safe online (e.g. when gaming) and the importance of keeping personal information private. They have also talked about secrets and surprises, including unsafe



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secrets, and when it might be the right thing to do to share a secret (if it makes them feel uncomfortable, scared or worried).

Next, they will be learning about the changes that happen our bodies during puberty, including menstruation.

Year Four

The children have been learning about the changes that will happen to bodies during puberty (physical and emotional). They recapped the menstrual cycle and had a look at a variety of period products including pads, tampons, moon cups, period pants and reusable pads. They discussed personal hygiene and the need to wash daily during puberty, as well as wearing clean clothes and deodorant. Year Four asked lots of great questions in these lessons and I look forward to answering more next week. They have been learning this topic in a very mature way, well done Year Four!

Next, they will be discussing wet dreams as another normal physical change that may occur during puberty. They will also be discussing secrets and surprises, including unsafe secrets and when it might be the right thing to share a secret (if it makes them feel uncomfortable, scared or worried).

Year Five

The children have been learning about the physical and emotional changes that will occur during puberty. They discussed the need to wash daily using soap, wearing deodorant and wearing clean clothes. They recapped the menstrual cycle and had a look at a variety of period products including pads, tampons, moon cups, period pants and reusable pads. Year Five were extremely mature when learning about this topic, I was very impressed.

Next, they will be learning the correct names for the external reproductive organs and will be debunking common myths about puberty.

Year Six

The children have been learning about managing changes in their life (e.g. moving house, starting a new school etc). They also recapped the changes that occur during puberty (both physical and emotional) and had a go at giving advice to others about these changes in an agony aunt format (e.g. dealing with spots, voices breaking, starting periods etc).

Next (after SATS week) they will be learning about how a baby is conceived which will include the non-statutory content mentioned during the RSE parental engagement session. This lesson is planned to be taught on Wednesday 22nd May, we will let you know if there is a change to this date.

Donaldson

Donaldson class have had a fantastic few weeks. We have been busy learning all about different animals as part of our topic 'Animal Safari' as part of this we read the story 'Snail Trail' by Ruth Brown and then we wrote the next page about where we thought the slimy snail might go to a water park, the beach or possibly on a slide at the park! We also learnt how spiders make their webs and what the webs do! We then had a go at making our own spiders webs using paper plates and threads after making holes in the plates to create a pattern for our web. Last week we thought about animal patterns and created some animal face masks using colourful paints, the children were able to choose the animal they painted and they looked fantastic!



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In Drawing Club we have read 'A Dark Dark Tale' by Ruth Brown and we have been busy using lots of codes to help bring our drawings to life! We drew a mouse in a dark dark box before creating a spooky mansion in the pitch black and inventing a machine to create more light. The children enjoyed sharing their ideas on the carpet before heading off to create their amazing drawings!

In maths we have been thinking about shapes and how we can manipulate and use them for specific purposes. We manipulated 2D shapes to create pictures and patterns, selecting the most appropriate shape. We have also been reminding ourselves of how to take numbers away using the song '5 currant buns' we have been starting off at 10 currant buns and using money to exchange the buns before counting how many are left. The children have really enjoyed this song and have been taking it into their continuous provision.

In phonics we have been practicing our reading by decoding longer words. This week we read 'shampoo' 'chimpanzee' 'windmill' 'sandpit' and many more! Try challenging your child to read some longer words at home using their phonics knowledge.

Next week we will be learning:

- Drawing Club – In Drawing Club we will be reading 'Penguin' by Polly Dunbar
- Maths – In Maths we will be thinking about 2D and 3D shapes
- Phonics – We will continue applying our phonics sounds and reading longer words
- Topic – In topic we will be thinking about animal habitats

Murphy

We have enjoyed our Literacy text 'Yeti and the Bird', and we are now planning our own story as we head towards the end of the unit. We have identified 2 contrasting characters, some of us chose to draw them and others chose to create them through the medium of transient art. We have planned our stories using story maps and character splats before we write them up.

In maths, we have finished our multiplication and division unit by grouping equal groups and sharing equal groups. We have started our new unit 'Fractions'; we have been recognising half of shape or object and half of a quantity.

As part of our History topic 'School Days' we really enjoyed touring our school and finding out about what our school used to be like! The children were amazed to learn that there used to be a pottery kiln and that there is a very old swimming pool within our school grounds! Please let Miss Haley know if you are aware of anyone who used to attend Oaklands as a previous pupil, we would love to have a visitor in class to share what life was like at Oaklands!

In science, we have been looking at plants, we have looked at seasonal changes in plants and have been on another tour of the school ground identifying, comparing, grouping and sorting a variety of common wild and garden plants. We recorded this information so we could extend our discussions back in class. We also used the 'Seek' app on the school iPad to identify plants that we were unsure of!



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Phonics has been focused on reviewing Phase 5 sounds and preparing for the Phonics Screening Check in June. The children are becoming more familiar with alien words and are applying their phonics to reading and writing with increased independence.

In the next few weeks, we will be learning:

- Maths - Recognising and finding quarter of an object, shape or quantity
- Science - Labelling and describing the basic structure of a variety of common plants.
- Art - Finishing our James Rizzi topic by becoming an artist and drawing or painting a place from memory, imagination or observation

Dahl

In Literacy, they have finished writing their equal to the story 'Grandads camper' where they used their own plans to expand on. They used expanded noun phrases, time connectives and conjunctions in their writing to make it entice the reader. They also used our editing stations to check and improve their work before finalising it. We have now started the book 'Dragon machine.' To start this book the children had a scavenger hunt in the hall and library to find as many dragon tails as they could in their groups. They then needed to write on their whiteboards where they found the tail, using prepositional words. They did a fantastic job at spotting the tails and used a range of prepositional words to describe where they found them. They used this to then write a guide on how to spot dragons.

In Maths, we have finished fractions which the children were amazing in. We have now started our new topic- time. We have started to look at o'clock and half past which recaps prior learning from year 1. They demonstrated fantastic prior knowledge of this topic and are ready to start reading the clock in 5 minute increments as well as quarter to and past.

In Science, we have been making the most of the summer weather by exploring the paddock to look at microhabitats such as under logs and in hedgerows. They used their observational skills and classification sheets to find different living things in these microhabitats. They have also used this information to complete a survival sheet for a chosen invertebrate that they found. They have shown lots of interest in this topic so far and they have enjoyed taking their learning outside the classroom. In Art, we have been putting our sketching skills to the test! The children brought in something that they thought represented themselves. They then posed with these objects like the monarchs used to. We had lots of fun doing this and thinking of a range of poses we could do. The children then used their observational skills to sketch each other into their art books. We took our sketch books outside to enjoy some relaxing sketching in the sun.

In Music, we have been learning our new song called 'The Friendship Song.' The children have demonstrated lots of rhythm to learn this as well as putting some actions to match the words. They have almost learnt all of this song which we enjoy singing at the end of the day and we are looking forward to creating our final piece with instruments as well.

In the following weeks we will be:

- Computing- making music using purple mash
- Literacy- the dragon machine



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- Maths- telling the time in 5-minute increments
- History- Alfred the Great and his reign
- P.E- team building, striking and fielding

Ahlberg

Ahlberg Class have linked their topic to Maths in the last two weeks by learning roman numerals during our unit of time. The class have enjoyed learning to tell the time on analogue clocks displaying roman numerals. We have also been looking at digital clocks as well as AM and PM.

In Literacy, we have been enjoying the book 'How to live forever'. We have looked at making inferences about characters. The children have looked at how characters might respond to each other and have practiced using inverted commas when writing speech. In Science, we have been looking at light and shadow. We looked at sun safety and how to keep ourselves safe when outside. The children have also looked at shadows and how they are created.

In D&T, we have been looking at mechanisms and cams. The children made moving models in pairs. In French, the class have learnt the names of some fruits.

Next week, we will be learning:

- Maths: Time - Hours and Minutes (durations)
- Literacy: Persuasive letter and a set of instructions.
- Science: Opaque, translucent and transparent
- History: Roman army

Morpurgo

Year 4 have had a brilliant couple of weeks as seen from our lovely class assembly this morning!

In Literacy, we have continued with our book *The Baker by the Sea*. We have explored different jobs and wrote job applications for those jobs. We have also written a blurb for the story ensuring to engage the reader and leave them wanting more.

In Maths, we have started and finished the topic of money and have looked at how we can add pounds and pence together. We have also worked out some word problems including money to see how much someone has after they have paid for something.

In Topic, we have started a new topic Ancient Civilisations. We have looked at a timeline of different civilisations and this week focused on starting to understand the ancient Egyptians.

In Science, we are looking into electrical circuits. We have also created circuits using different components and worked out which circuits will work with different elements. If there are too many components that take up electricity, then one battery will not be enough to power it.

In music, we have continued with our ukulele lessons. We have one more lesson left and I know that the children have loved having these lessons! So much time and practice has gone into learning a new instrument and I am very proud of how engaged and persistent the children have been.

Over the next fortnight we will be learning:

- Literacy - Creating a tourist brochure.



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- Maths - Starting the next topic on time.
- Topic - Understand more about ancient Egypt.
- PE - Athletics and Dodgeball.

Westall

In literacy, we are continuing to read 'Kasper, Prince of Cats' by Michael Morpurgo. We created posters inviting people on board the Titanic, using superlatives and comparatives. We also created a risk assessment report on icebergs, using the passive voice and modal verbs.

In maths, we have finished our unit on shape. We looked at angles, regular and irregular polygons and 3D shapes. We are now exploring position and direction and have started to read and plot out co-ordinates.

This week in history, we have been studying life in the Minoan period and how it changed over time. First, we created historical enquiry questions to research and then used the information pack to find the answers. We displayed our findings in a poster.

In Science, we have started out new topic 'Properties and changes of materials'. For our first lesson, we recapped on our prior knowledge and then worked in groups to conduct tests on the properties of everyday materials using resources, such as water, magnets and electrical circuits.

In RE, we are learning about the Christian festival 'Pentecost' which is celebrated 50 days after Easter and is the birthday of the church. In our first lesson, we greeted each other in different languages and learnt simple phrases in French and Spanish. We discussed the level of difficult it was to say the words in a foreign language and related it to how Christians believe that Jesus' disciples received the gift of the holy spirit at Pentecost. They then started to speak in different languages, without even trying.

In French we have been learning how to ask each other where we live, including the abode and area. In PE, we worked in groups of six to develop our planning and problem skills. We formed a circle and had to communicate verbally and non verbally how we wanted the ball to be passed successfully to each other.

In the next fortnight we will be learning:

- Maths: about lines of symmetry.
- Literacy: to write a newspaper article.
- Science: about thermal conductivity.
- History: to compare the Minoans and the Mycenaean civilisations.
- French: about different rooms in the house.
- RE: about the fruits of the Holy Spirit.

Tolkien

We have been getting ready for SATs so have been doing lots of grammar and maths revision including topics such as fractions, prefixes and passive/active voice.



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In Literacy we have been planning and writing our own narratives based on Boy in the Tower.

In History we have looked at a variety of wars that Britain has been involved in.

In Art we have created modern art by distorting 'normal' images.

In Science we have begun our 'Inheritance and Evolution' topic by looking at various biodiversity.

Coming up...

- In Literacy we will write about extended narratives with our own plot.
- In Maths we will investigate real world problems.
- In Computing we will be looking at blogging and emailing.
